As we look back on 2020, the word that seems to best describe the year is "pivot." A pivot is something that turns, hinges, with the ability to adjust while staying anchored. To pivot is to change direction, to adapt, to improve. The pandemic required Benjamin Rose Institute on Aging to reconsider our programs and services and how to best meet the needs of older adults and their families. We had to challenge assumptions about the way we do business and find new ways to deliver on our mission to support caregivers and empower all people to age well through research, consumer-responsive services and client advocacy.

One definition of pivot comes from sports. A basketball player holding the ball is able to turn on one foot, the pivot, to scan the court, find an open teammate, or initiate a play. The center on the team, usually the tallest player, is sometimes referred to as the "pivot", and many set plays in basketball involve a pass to the center, the pivot, who can then pass, shoot or drive to the basket. Regardless of the play, the goal is the same. In 2020, our service models may have changed, the staff and volunteers may have deployed differently, we found new partners in service and new ways to work with existing community partners, but our goal, our mission, remained the same.

In a period of dramatic change, when creativity, flexibility and patience were required, Benjamin Rose and its subsidiaries served more people and touched more lives. It was a remarkable year and one that called on all of us to rethink what we do, and how we do it. It is a story not only about our board, staff, and volunteers, but also the many individuals and organizations that helped make the work possible. Thank you for being part of that story.


