

The Divided Classroom Set-Up uses both conference rooms A and B, but with a partition separating the two rooms.
There are two sets of entry/exit doors into the conference room A. When you walk through the first door, there is a screen that can be raised or lowered on the left-hand side at the front of the room, and at the back of the room towards the right-hand side is the partition separating you from conference room $B$.

In conference room A, there are five rows of five tables from the front to the back of the room. Each row has 10 chairs behind the tables. There are 50 seats in total, and 25 tables in total. The rows face a podium at the front of the room.

There is one entry/exit door leading into conference room B. When you walk through the door, there is a partition separating you from conference room A on the left-hand side, and windows looking out at the Cleveland skyline on the right-hand side.

In conference room B, there are four rows running from the front of the room opposite the door to the back of the room by the door. The first three rows have three tables with six chairs two chairs behind each table. The fourth row has two tables and four chairs. There are 22 seats in total, and 11 tables in total. The rows face a podium at the front of the room opposite the door.
